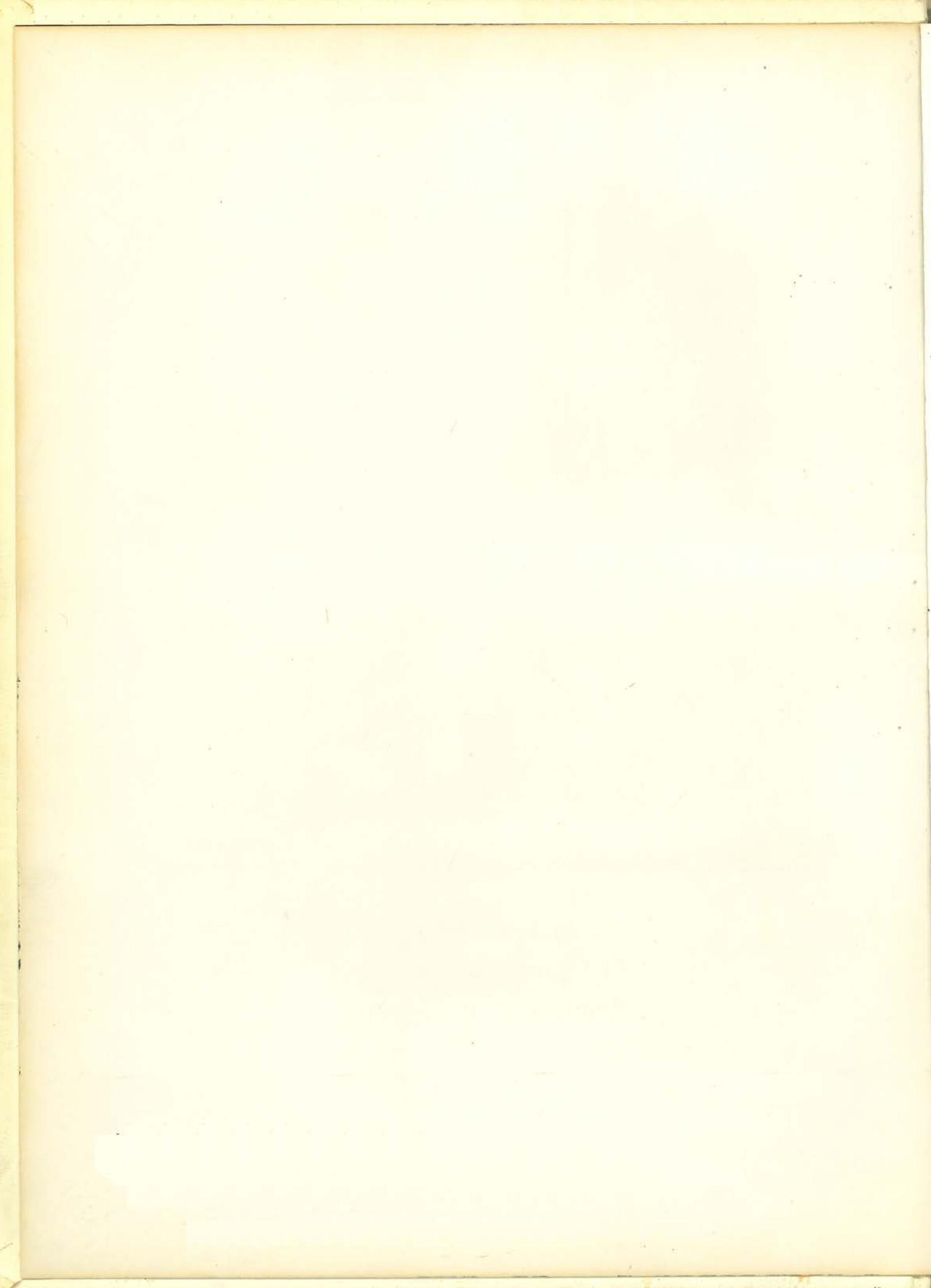

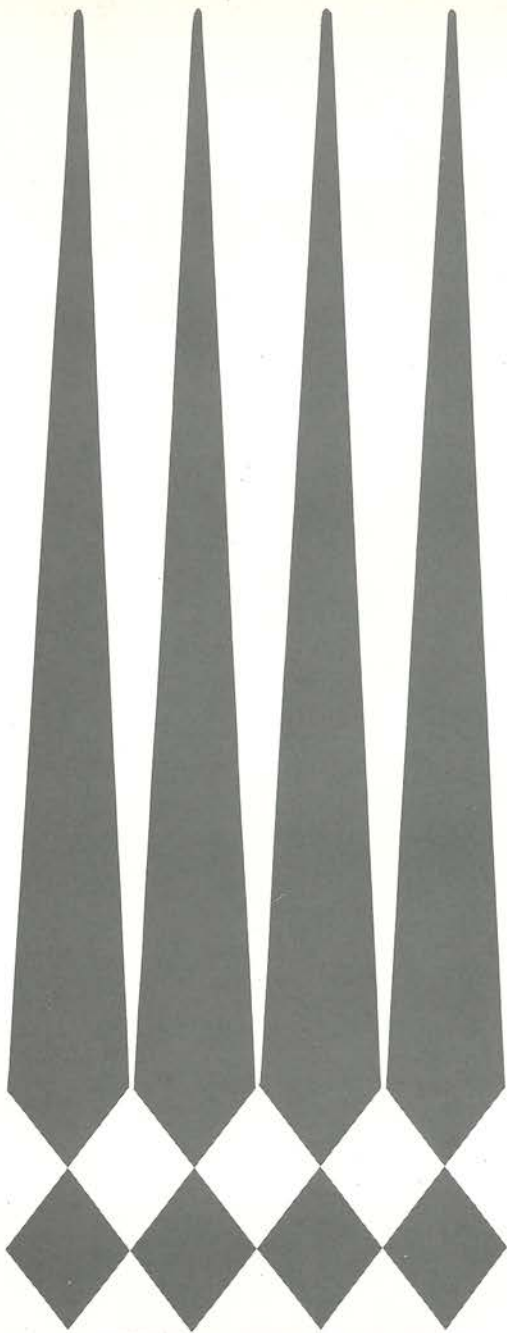


DEDICATION TO MR. R.D. RORABAUGH

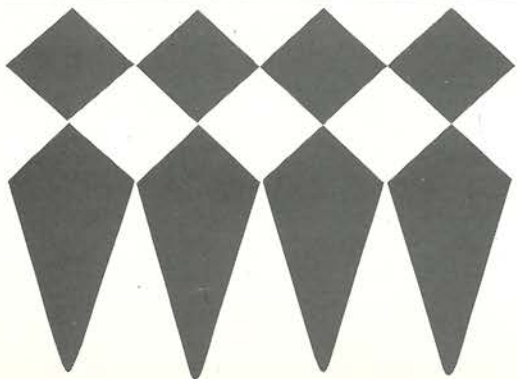

Class History
