JEANETTE RUSH went into show business as a chorus girl. After twenty-five years in the back line, she moved up to be the star. Sock it to 'em, Jeanette.

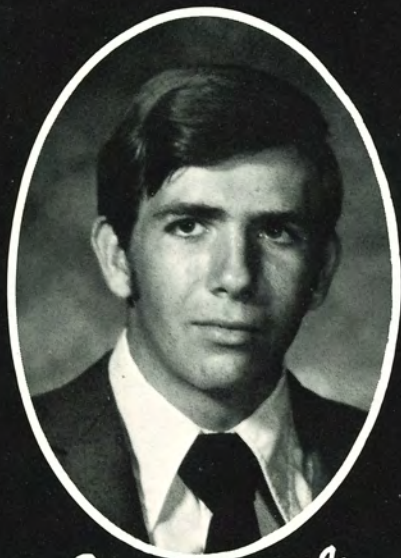

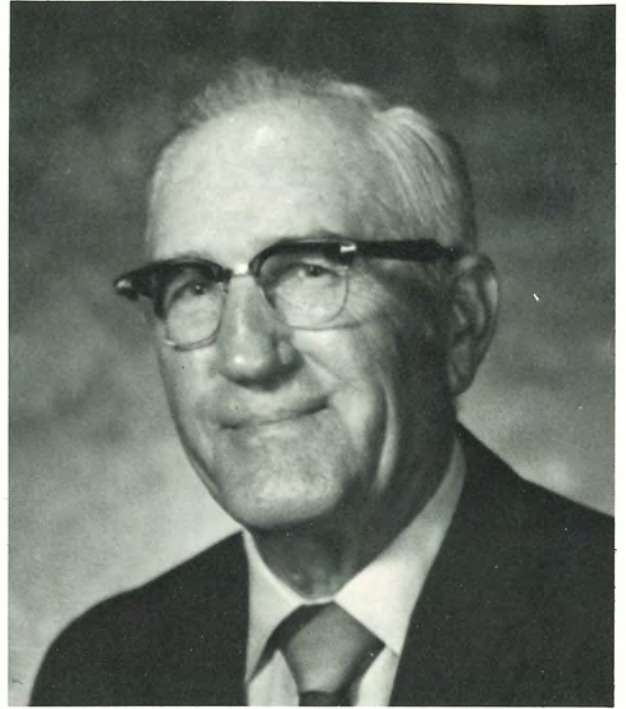
