## Math/Science

Mrs. Michelle Newkirk taught four math subjects: Algebra I, Algebra II, college algebra, and math fundamentals. Mr. Luke Hall, student teacher, taught with her during the second semester.

In Algebra 1, students built their essay skills. Algebra 2 students built math skills and learned new ones. College algebra students learned math skills that would prepare
them for future college classes. In math fundamentals students built on their math skills to prepare for state assessments.

Mr. Douglas Fisher taught Algebra 1, geometry, and pre- algebra. Students in Algebra 1 were split between Mrs. Newkirk and Mr. Fisher. In geometry, students learned dimensions of lines and other details of
working with shapes, such as triangles.

Mr. Kevin McNorton taught biology, chemistry, and earth and space science. Freshmen and sophomores took biology.
