Wm. Martin Lear was born in Stark County, Ohio February 17, 1876 and died in White Cloud, Kansas, July 21st., 1912, aged 66 years, 5 months I/2 day. He had been in failing health for over a year from a disease of a dropsical nature but the immediate cause of his death was heart and lung trouble. he was confined to his bed about 5 weeks and at times, his suffering was intense but the end came peacefully.

The funeral services were conducted at the home on Tuesday afternoon at 2:30 O'Clock, by Rev. Saville, of the M.E. Church, and the remains were laid to rest in Olive Branch Cemetery by the side of his wife, who preceded him to the grave just 12 years to the day.

His early boyhood days were spent on a farm in Coshocton County, Ohio. He enlisted in the Civil War July 22, 1863 at the age of 17 and was honorably discharged at Camp Chase, Ohio June 10th, 1865. After the war he worked at the cooper and carpenter trade at different places in Ohio and Illinois. He was married October 15th, 1876 at Cuba, Illinois to Mary Jane Winship. To this union were born three children, two dying in infancy, the other, a daughter, Mrs. M.C. Barrett, residing at this place.

In 1879, he came West and settled in Jewell County, Kansas, and about 10 years later, moved to White Cloud, which has since been his home. Phillip Newton Lear, was born in Stark County, Ohio, February 8th, 1850, died in White Cloud, Kansas, September 4, 1912, aged 62 years, 6 months and 26 days. He had been failing rapidly the past six months from heart disorders, which terminated in dropsy and caused his death. That his brother, Mart, preceded him to the grave less than six weeks from the same identical cause is a most singular coincidence. His early life was spent on a farm in Stark County, Ohio. At the age of 23 he was married to Miss Sarah Mutchler at Hollis, Illinois. To this union were born thirteen children, eleven of whom survive him -- two dying in infancy. In the summer of '78 he with his mother and family immigrated to Western Kansas where he homesteaded, but two consecutive crop failures forced him to leave his claim and he started back for his native state in the Spring of '81. On arriving at White Cloud, (that being high water year) it was impossible to cross the rive at this point. Circumstances changed his plans later and he has lived here ever since. "Newt" was a man of strong personality and a deep thinker on any subject. "Twas not a few that came to him for advice on subjects that were too deep for them to fathom. His suffering was intense and only a few hours before his death did he realize the end was so near when he called his family to his bedside and taking each one singly by the hand gave them such fatherly advice as will never be forgotten. All of the family with one exception were at his bedside when he died. Will, the oldest, who lives in Washington, being unable to come. He leaves besides his wife to mourn his loss, one brother, Sam Lear of this city, also a half-brother, F.W. Soverns of Bolivar, Mo., and the following children: Wm. Lear of Clarkston, Washington, Mrs. W.E. Wolfley of Hiawatha, Kansas, Mrs. P.F. Kirwin of Everest, Kansas, Mrs. William Strunk, Mrs. F.M. Dodd, Pete, Maud, Charles, Newton, Jr., Freda and Cicely, also four grandchildren of this place. Funeral services were conducted at the house Friday afternoon at 3 O'Clock by Rev.
