## History In The Making

April 23, 1974, the THS construction bond was passed, and Glaze Construction Company, St. Joe, was hired. Mr. Lee Grover, representative from Glaze Construction Co. , and Mr. Henry Lockard, architect from Horst, Terrill, and Karst, were present at the contract signing.
