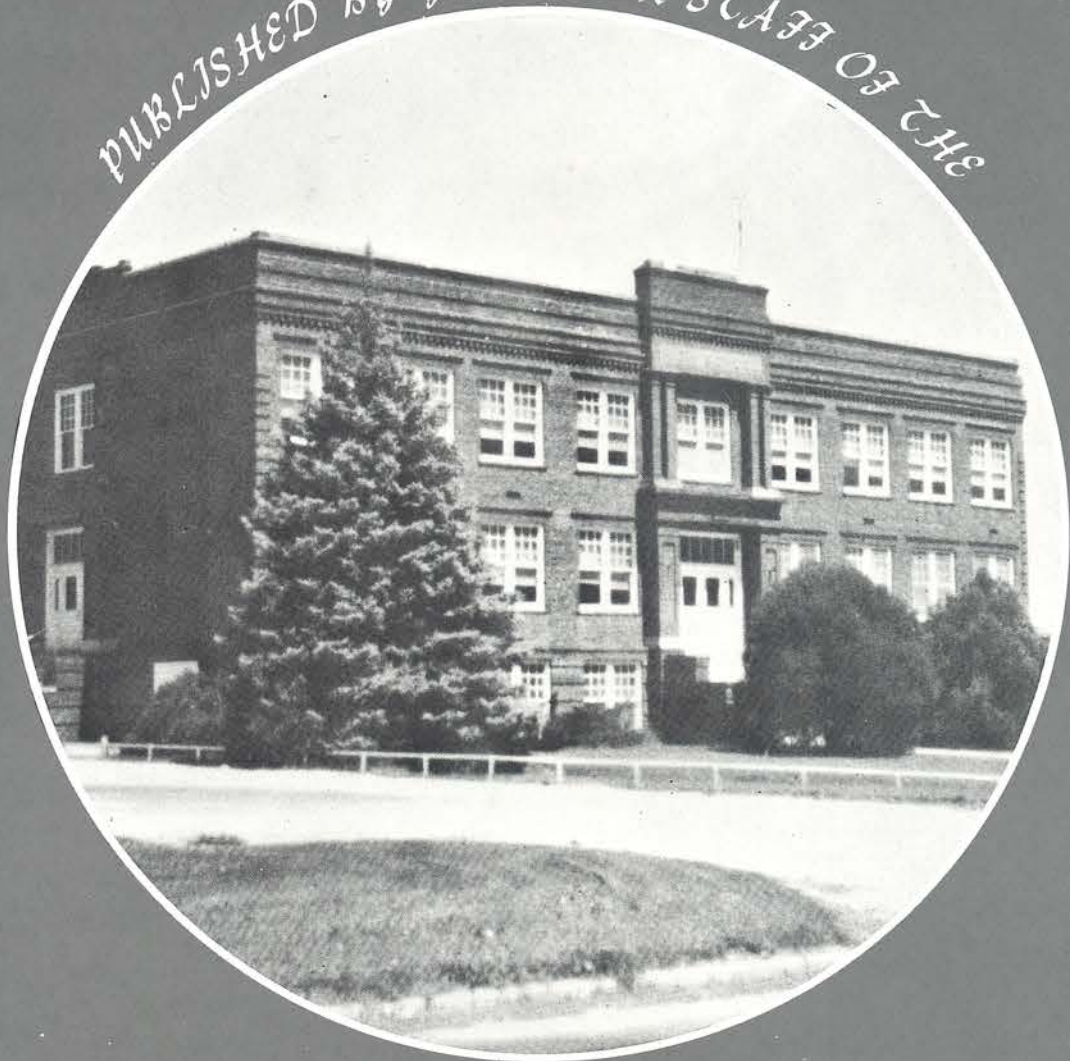

Sunrise....symbol of a new beginning.

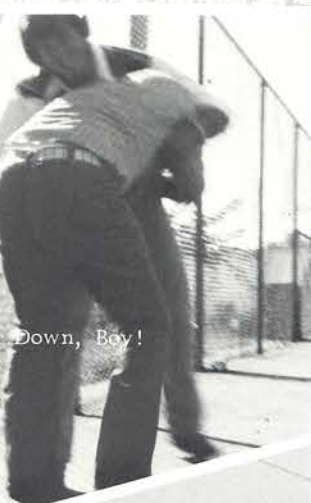

The Cross Country had the honor of winning the first trophy to be put in the new school by placing 2nd in the League meet.

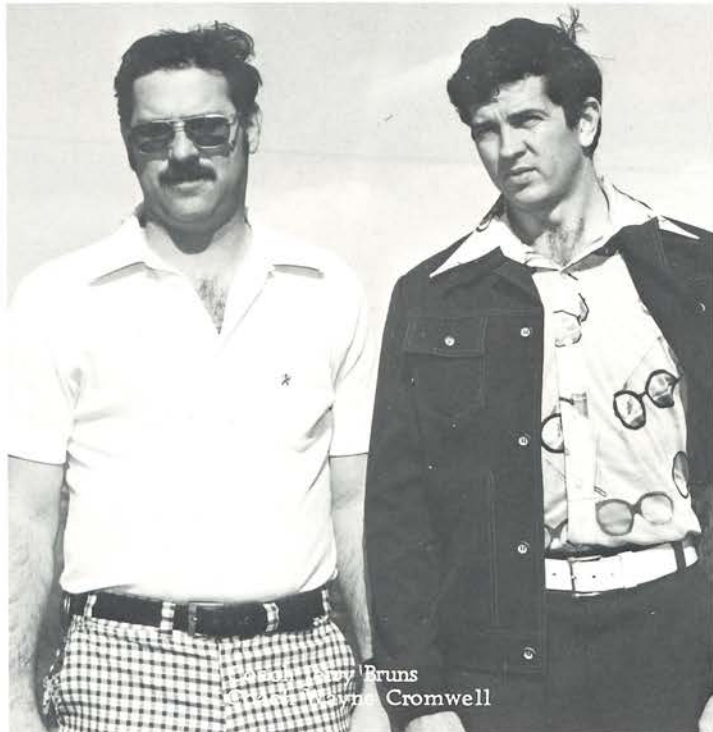
