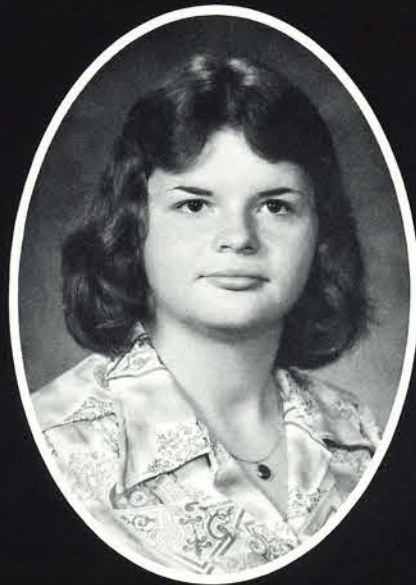
For Senior Sneak we journeyed down to the Lake of the Ozarks. We stayed at Kalfran Lodge.
