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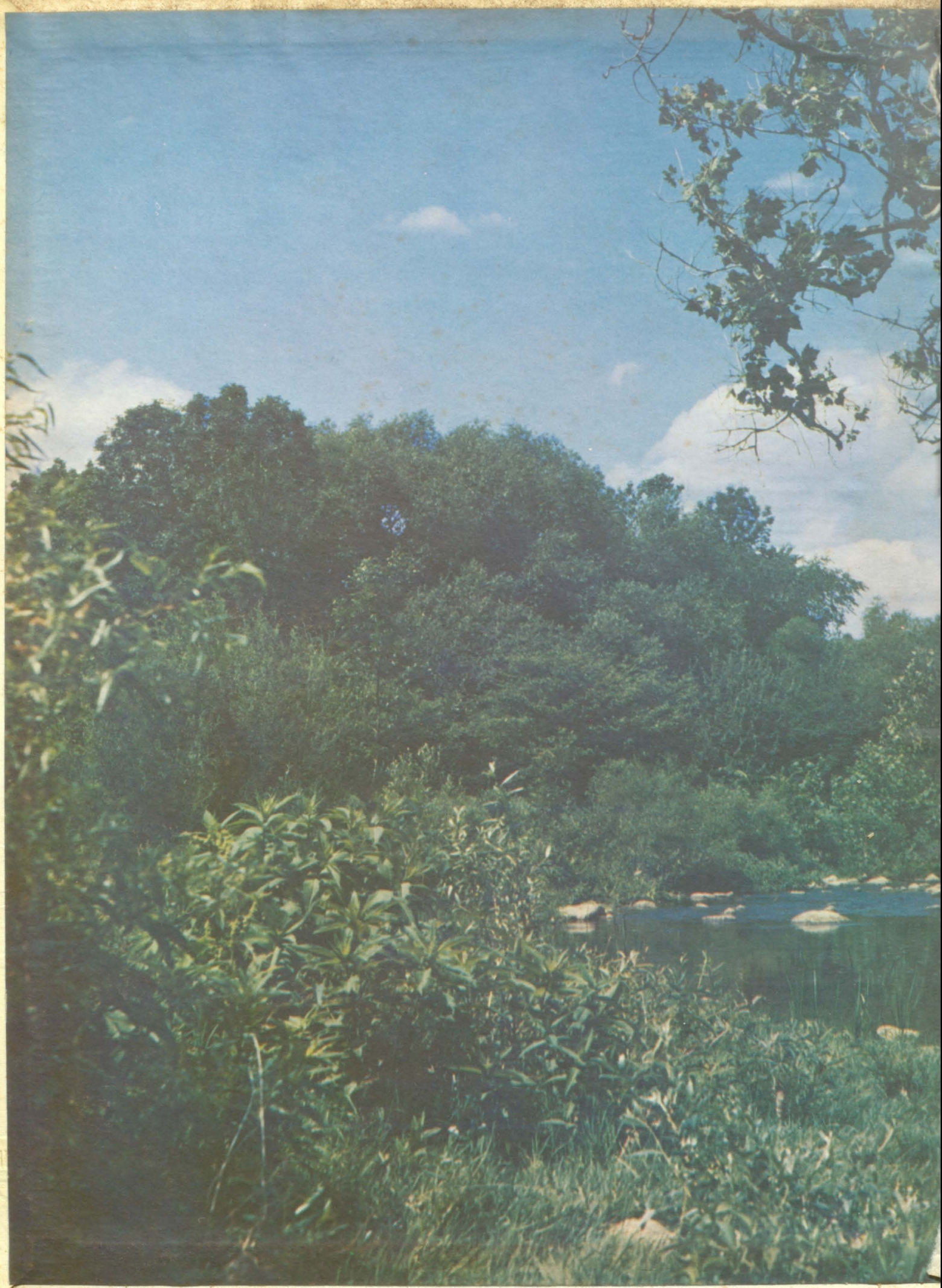
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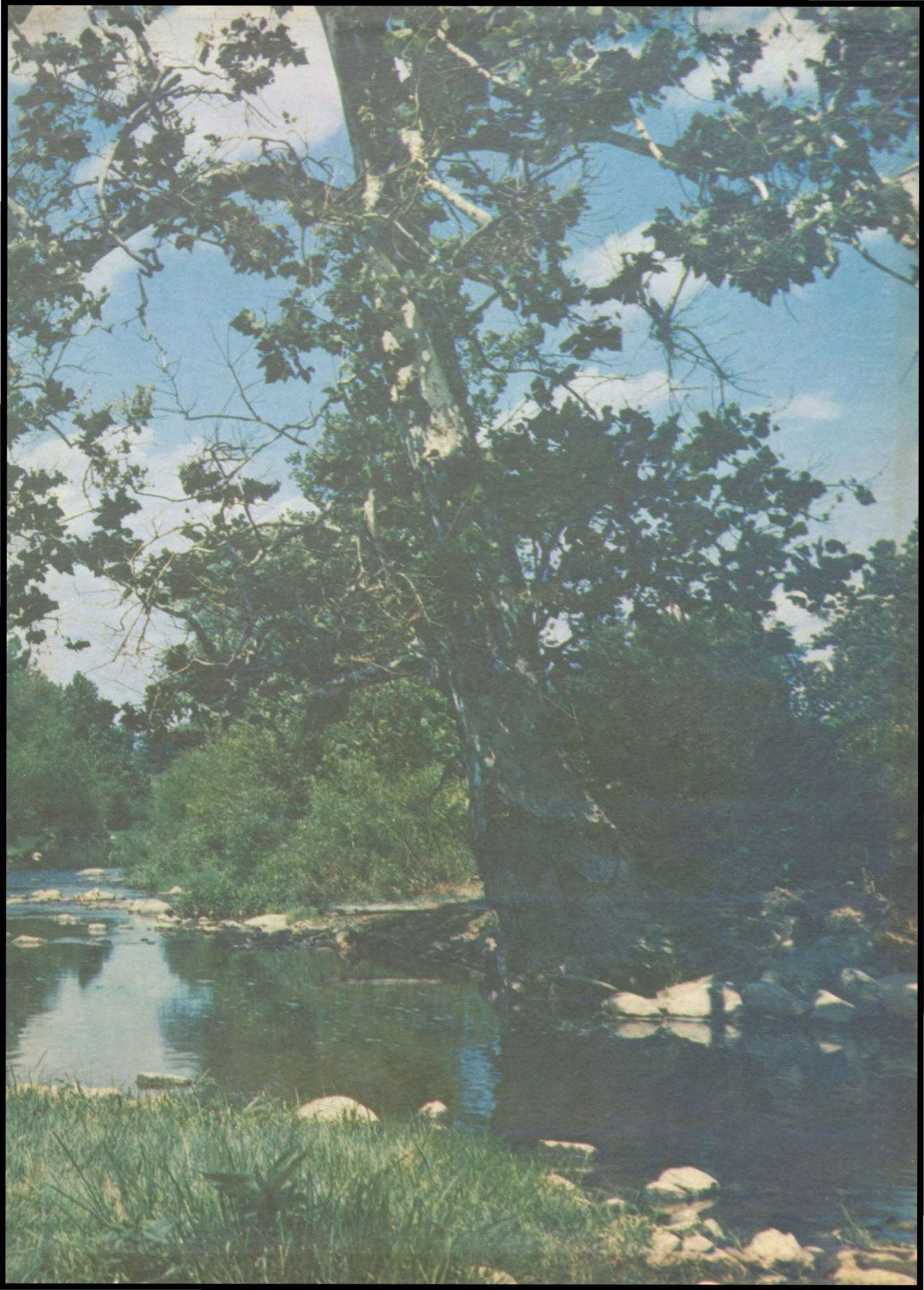
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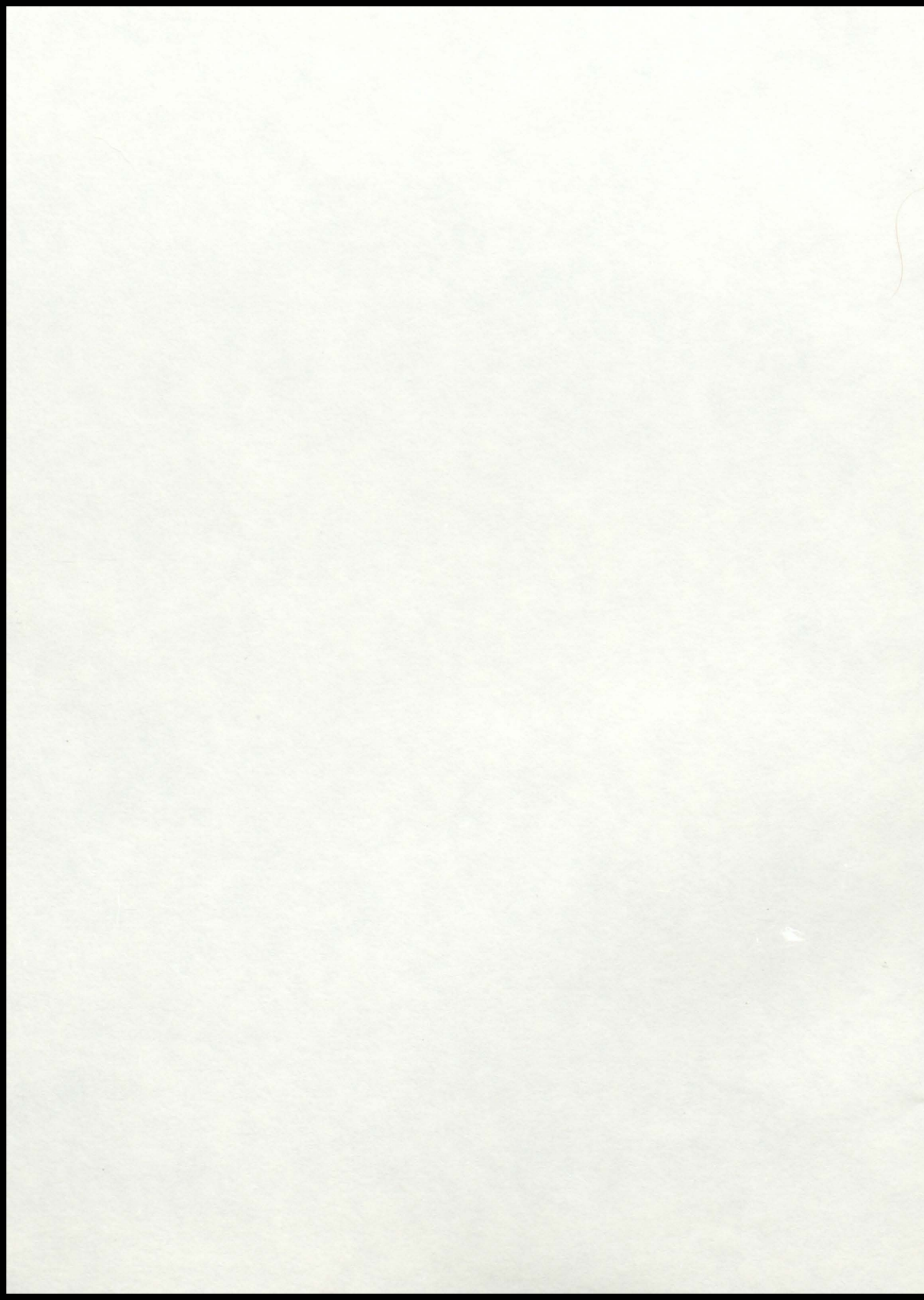

Little have we realized the time, effort, and patience you have spent in starting us out as good useful citizens.

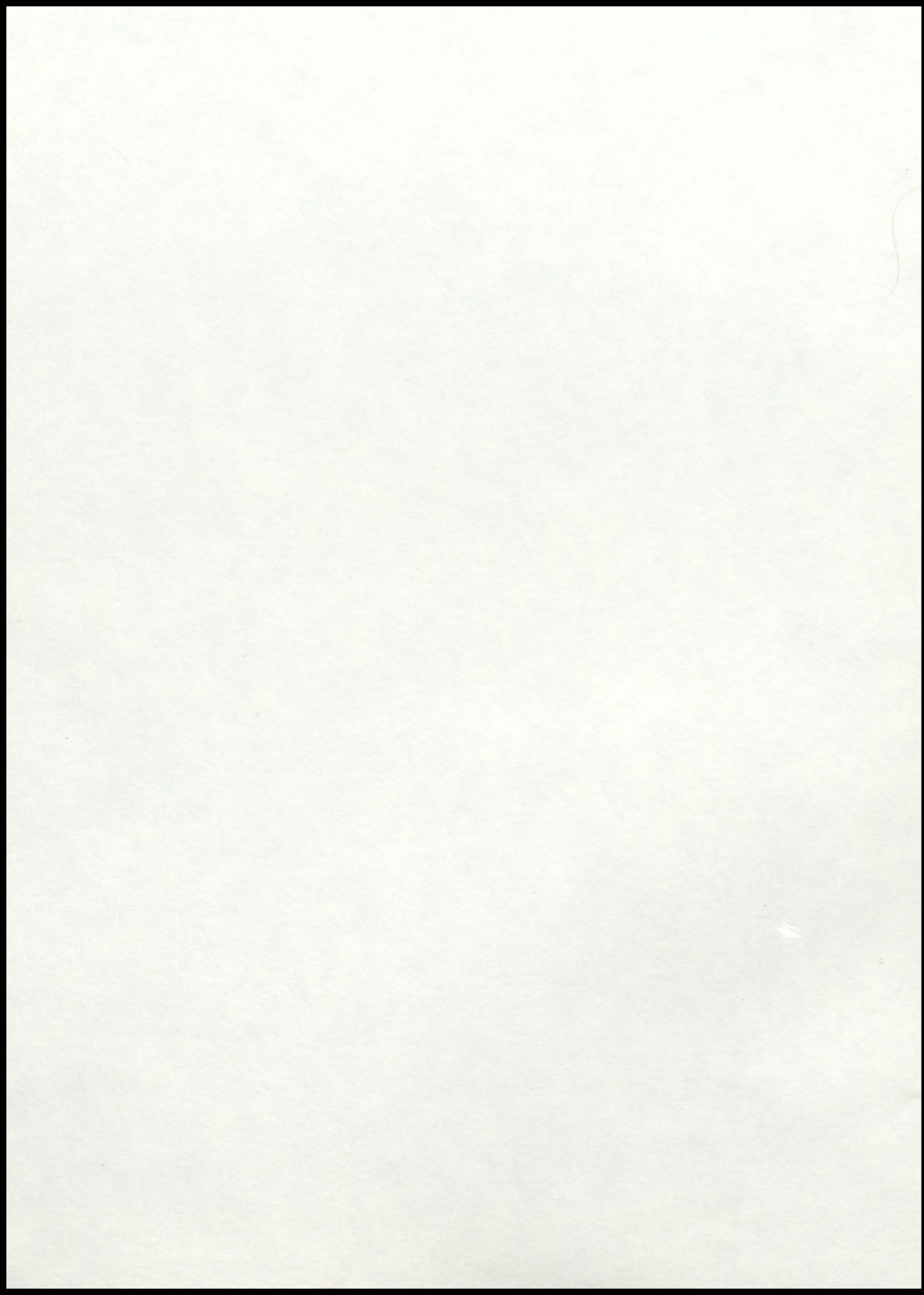

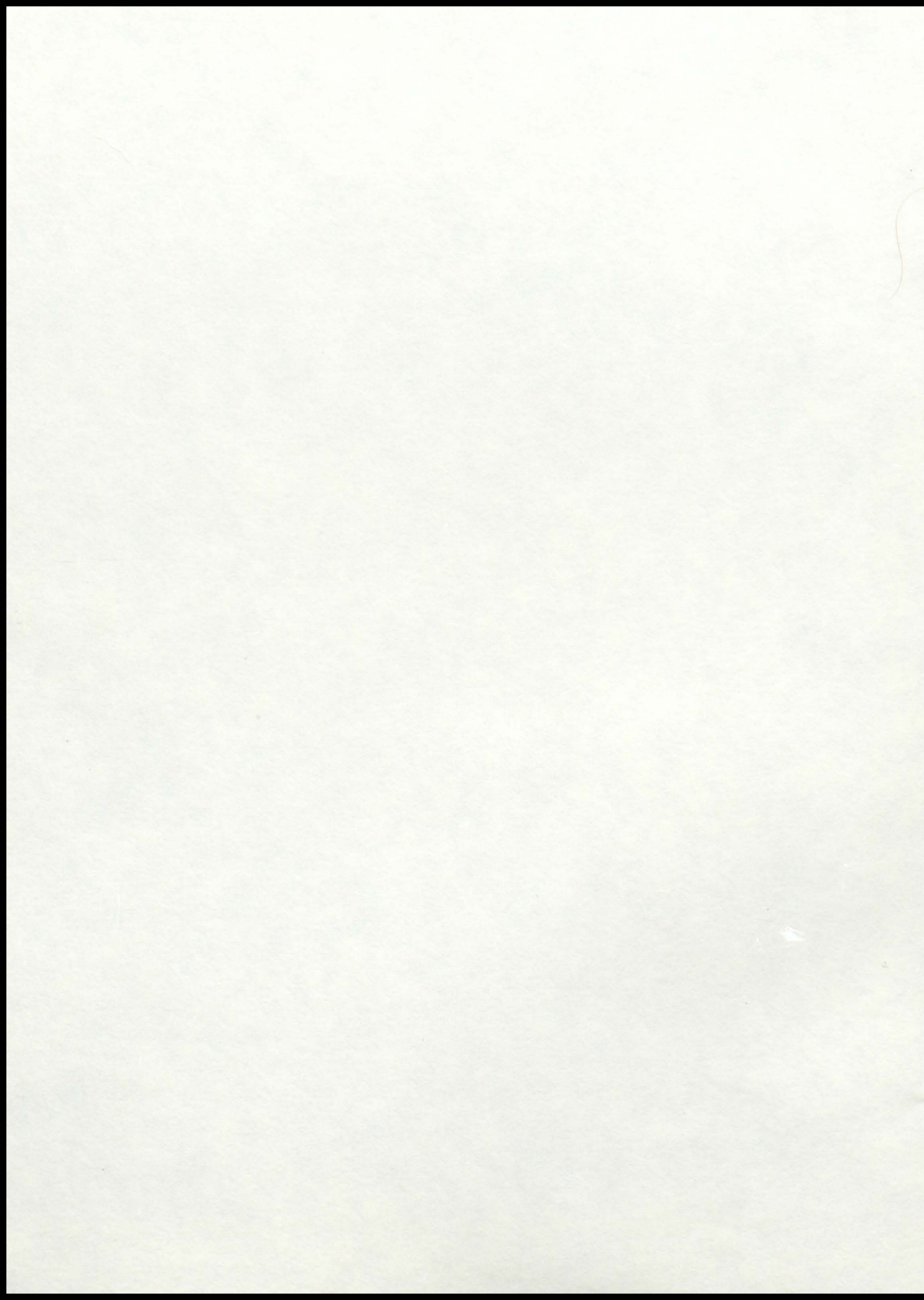
"Well, this certainly has been a trying day!" I said.

I, Shirley Howes, will my perfect attendance record to any Freshman who would like to obtain such a record and my typing ability to Delila Cadue.

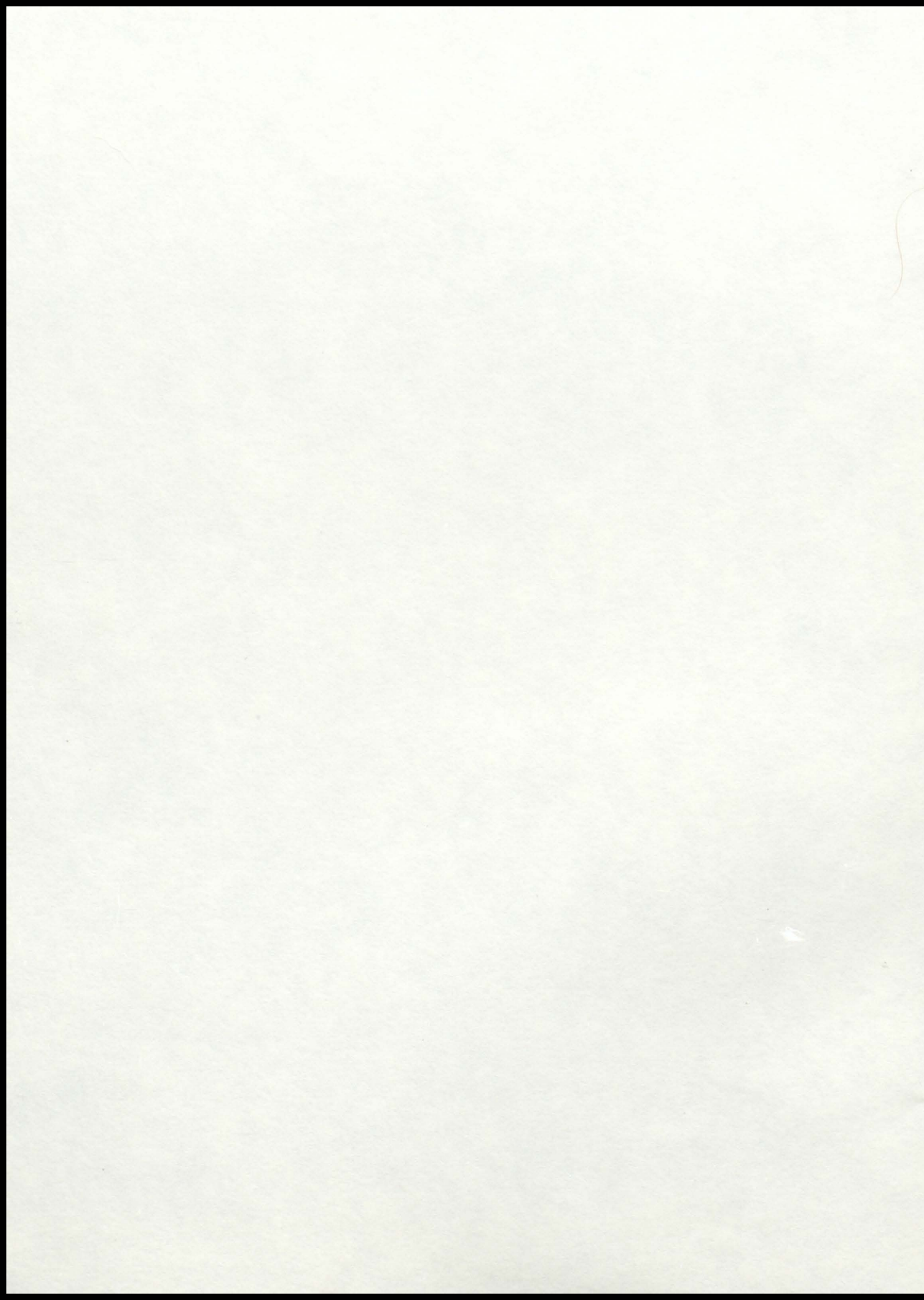
I, Betty Bohnenkemper, will my part time job on Saturdays to Ruthetta Hower and my place on the honor roll to anyone who needs the grades for basketball.

I, Doris Mosher, will my bad temper to Kay Smith, my height to Judy Maxwell, and my black hair to Shirley Brown.

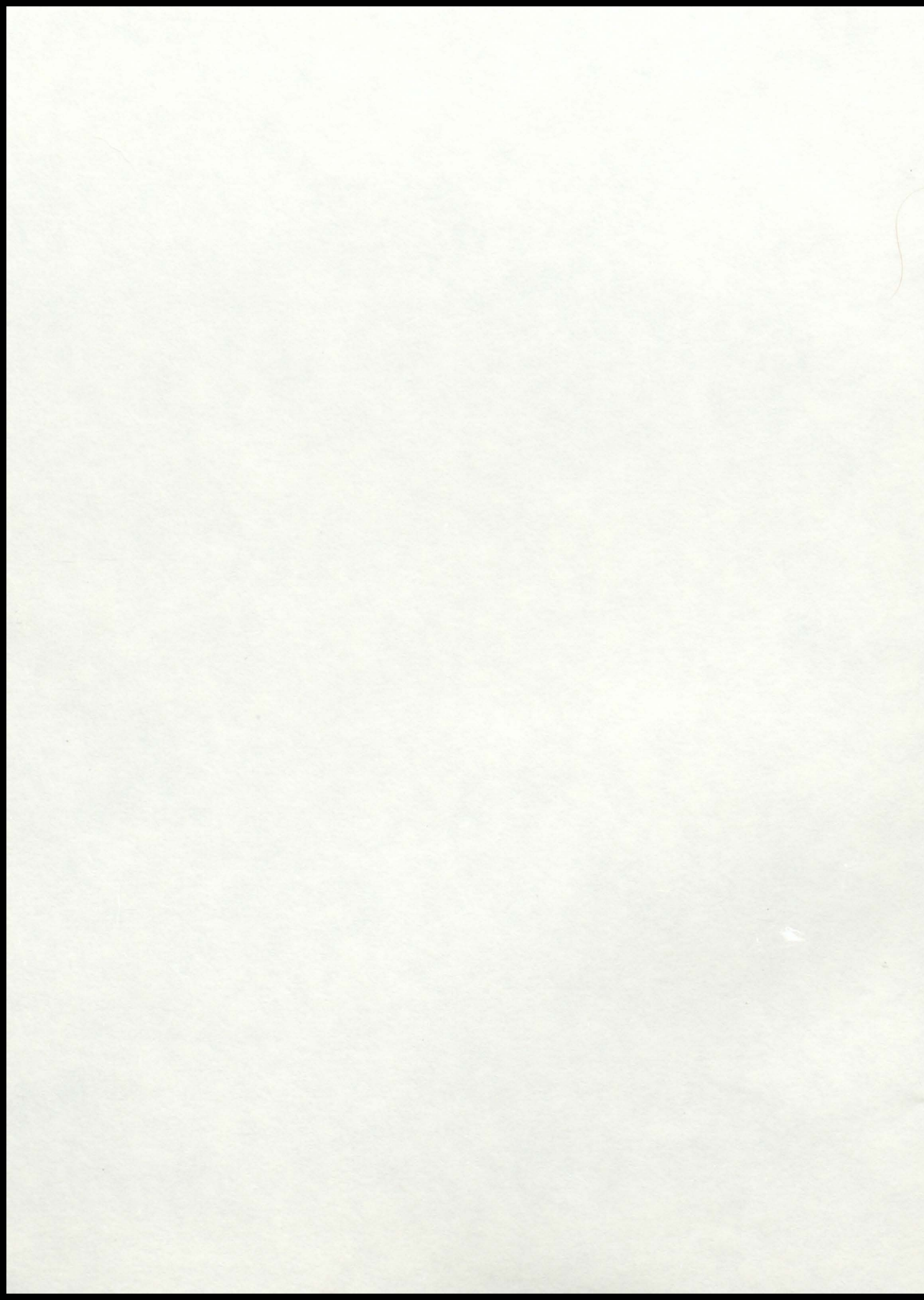
