Graduates should also utilize their on-campus career centers to help guide a job search, tailor resumes and set up interviews. In addition, use these strategies to increase the chances that you'll find, and land, a satisfying first job:

• No employment history? New grads without traditional work experience should include an "Experience" section on their resume rather than "Employment." Volun-

teer positions, class projects and independent study fit into this category and will show employers work ethic and ambition.

• Mock interviews. After the resume has been tweaked and the application sent, practice those interviewing skills with family and friends. Entry-level seekers should be able to provide a concise overview of their background and thoughtful answers about why they are interested in a particular company.


• Research, research, research. In today's information age, there is no excuse for going into an interview without properly researching a company. Investigating corporate Web sites as well as online databases of corporate profiles, such as Hoover's, is a great way to learn about prospective employers.


• Don't give up! If you're not getting the results you desire, try a new strategy. Consider taking an internship; 59 percent of 2005 grads surveyed have already completed at least one. It's a valuable way to get a behind-thescenes glimpse into your desired field and increase your chances of getting a full-time position with that company.


Most importantly, start this
