
Trojan Trumpet THS Journalists take first in state

Journalism competitors from Troy High School placed first for class 1a schools at State competition Saturday, May 2, at the University of Kansas. The competition is sponsored by the Kansas Scholastic Press Association.

Students who placed from Troy were Sarah Greub, 1st in advertising; Desiree Weatherford and Ashley Miller competing as a team, 2nd in broadcasting; Daniel Dominguez, 3rd in infographics; and Mackenzie Clary, editorial cartoon;

At Kansas State Speech Festival, Saturday, May 2, at Kansas City Kansas Community College, four Troy High School students competed, earning two I ratings and two II ratings.

Daniel Dominguez earned two I ratings for his presentations in oral interpretation of poetry and humorous solo acting. Kerya Wykert received a II for her informative speech, and Ashley Miller and Desiree Weatherford earned a II for their improvised duet act.


The adviser for Troy school publications is MarthaJean Rockey. In her career at Troy, this is the third time her students have won sweepstakes in KSPA competition.

In 2008, Troy took second place overall in sweepstakes for 1a schools.

To qualify for state competition the students first had to place at regional contest at Kansas State University in February.

At state competition all high schools competed, with a total of 1,056 entries.

Dominguez's poem was "A Moment of Silence Before I Begin This Poem," a poem in free verse arguing for silence for all the war dead of all wars. His act-

ing piece was "Accents, Inc.," a piece that calls for the performer to "slip seamlessly" from one dialect to another, including proper British, Cockney, German, French,

and others. At the end the performer recites the Pledge of Allegiance, sliding from one dialect to another.

Wykert's informative speech was "Sideshow Curiosities," in which she discusses the most famous of the side shows, their most famous fake exhibits, and some of the real people exhibited in side shows.

Weatherford and Miller in their presentation had to create and perform a short scene on site.


The students also performed Friday night, May 1, at the Troy Fine Arts Night.




