




This was also to be the last year for Mr. William Foster to teach in the THS system. After eleven years as science teacher, he resigned to continue his education.




Miss Sharon Dwyer teaches English and French and is the sophomore class sponsor.

Mr. Nicholas Dannevik is the counselor. He teaches freshman English and psychology.







Tennis was added to the list of sports at Troy with Frank Davis as the coach. The team had six meets scheduled.














Graduation for the seniors: the ending of high school, but still just the beginning in the advancement up the ladder of life.














