Memories of an Old School Teacher

Pedagogue of 1864 in the Old Petersburg District Gives Reminiscences of Early Days in the Crude Schoolhouse Made of Rough Lumber—Seats for the Pupils Were Made From the First Slab Cut From the Log, and Had No Backs—Desks Were Placed Against the Side of the House With the Scholars Facing the Wall—No Ceiling and No Plaster—Huge Stove Was Largest Piece of Furniture in the Room.

The difference between present school accommodations and those of the early days of Doniphan County, are so pronounced that it is doubtful if modern children would learn anything if they were compelled to undergo the discomforts suffered by their parents. Nowadays school children must have steam heat and varnished desks, polished chairs, and all manner of toilet incidentals. The wonder is what they would do in the old log school house with rough slabs of logs

bers were noted for their liberality, paid me \$24 per month, or \$1 per day—munificent sum, indeed. After teaching three years in Ohio, I decided to go West and follow the advice of Horace Greeley, then commonly quoted by every school boy: "Young man, go West, and grow up with the country."

On August 20, 1864, I arrived at St. Joseph, which was then merely a struggling trading post, and crossed the river in a ferryboat, landing in El-

to teach in the Petersburg district. The school board engaged me to teach for the term, agreeing to pay me \$40 per month. The wages were fair enough for the time, but in order to appreciate the surroundings, I will fully describe my school. The Petersburg school was a new house, about 20x26 feet in dimensions. It was constructed of cottonwood and sycamore lumber, fresh from the sawmill in Petersburg. The shingles were of cottonwood, made with a fro. The floor was of sycamore planks. The seats were made of the first slab cut from the log, and had holes bored in them, where legs, or rather supports, were stuck in. They had no backs. The writing desks were just as crude, being fastened permanently against the side of the house, so that when the scholar was writing, his back was toward the teacher.

The stove was an old-time box affair, with a large round drum on it. It was the most pretentious piece of furniture in the room, and looked very much like the stove in Henry Kotch's

The walls of the building were weather-boarded with native cottonwood lumber, but there was no plaster anywhere. The school house was situated between two bluffs, one on the east, and the other on the west, both covered with a dense growth of large forest timber. This fact made it appear as though the sun set unusually early in the evening, and on cloudy days I would have to dismiss school very early as, of course, we were not furnished with lighting facilities of any kind.

I lost no time in starting, and everything was soon running smoothly. At the end of two weeks, I had enrolled 125 pupils of all sizes and ages, from five to twenty-one years old. We had all kinds of text-books. Some had been used in different states, and one or two had even come from a foreign country. Imagine a modern teacher's chagrin at such a predicament! After I had been employed two weeks, I notified the school board to come on Monday morning and look over the school and see how I was progressing.

for seats, no ceiling to the room, and the walls all unplastered. I shall endeavor to give a description of old-time school conditions in Doniphan County and other places where I taught. My first Kansas experience was in the old Petersburg school, fourteen miles southeast of Troy, and in other Doniphan County schools afterward.

My very first experience in teaching was in the state of Ohio. I received the paltry sum of \$20 per month for twenty-two days, and that was considered the average price those days. The next year, a board whose mem-

ber, very much of a town at that time, and far ahead of her Missouri sister, St. Joseph. It did not take long to get to Petersburg in Doniphan County, about eight or ten miles southwest of St. Joseph. I have lived in this county ever since. That was my first visit to Kansas, and I can vividly recall the strangeness of the scene and the difference in those times and modern days.

After the necessary preliminaries were over, such as making myself known to influential people and putting in my application and stating my qualifications, I was eventually hired

wagon shop today. It would take in a four-foot cordwood stick without cutting it in two, and it is opportune to say in this connection that the boys were expected to prepare the wood for use, and there was always a neat woodpile near the stove. Then there was the inevitable wooden bucket of water with a tin dipper handy, and it was alarming the amount of water some of those children consumed. They maneuvered for any excuse to leave their seats. Some of the restless boys even welcomed a chance to stand with their face in a corner, it seemed to me.

They were on hand very early. Some of the board members thought I had been having trouble with some of the older scholars, but such was not the case. Everything was very pleasant, but the school board, unable to believe their own eyes, stayed until after recess anyhow. They had never been called upon before, except in case of trouble. I simply wanted them to see that the children were learning, and that relations between myself and my pupils were harmonious. The board was evidently satisfied, as they increased my pay from \$40 to \$65 per month. Then I hired a young man to
